NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by Jim McCauley, Placer County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters, in accordance with the provisions of the Election Laws of the State of California, on Tuesday, June 5, 2012 there will be a Presidential Primary Election.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that official nomination petitions and declarations of candidacy for eligible Placer County residents desiring to file for an elective office may be obtained from the Placer County Office of Elections, 2956 Richardson Drive, Auburn, CA 95603. Completed Placer County nomination petitions and declarations of candidacy shall be returned to the Office of Elections for filing.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that filing opened Monday, February 13, 2012 and will close Friday, March 9, 2012, after which time no declarations of candidacy may be accepted for filing. If an incumbent does not file his or her declaration of candidacy on or before March 9, 2012, the period for all nonincumbents to obtain and return declarations of candidacy will be extended to March 14, 2012.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the hours for filing nomination petitions and declarations of candidacy during the filing period (and extended filing period, if necessary) will be Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM excluding holidays. The Office of Elections will be open on February 13, 2012 and February 20, 2012 from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that consolidated with the Presidential Primary Election the following measure shall be put to a vote of the qualified voters in the City of Auburn:

**MEASURE A – City of Auburn**

Shall the Home Rule for Auburn Charter of 2012 be adopted?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that consolidated with the Presidential Primary Election the following measure shall be put to a vote of the qualified voters in the Foresthill Public Utility District:

**MEASURE C – Foresthill Public Utility District**

Shall Measure B, which rolled back the District's water rates, be repealed to allow the District to set rates sufficient to meet the costs of providing water service?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that consolidated with the Presidential Primary Election the following measure shall be put to a vote of the qualified voters in North Auburn-Ophir Fire (CSA 28, Zone 193):

**MEASURE D – North Auburn-Ophir Fire (CSA 28, Zone 193)**

Shall an ordinance be adopted to increase existing direct charges for residential development by \$40 per unit; for mobile home parks by \$20 per unit; for commercial/ industrial development by \$.046 per square foot for fire protection, emergency medical, prevention services and equipment replacement in North Auburn – Ophir Fire (CSA 28, Zone 193). Charges approved in this measure are subject to an annual cost of living Adjustment not to exceed 3% in any year.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that consolidated with the Presidential Primary Election the following measure shall be put to a vote of the qualified voters in the Placer Hills Fire Protection District:

## **MEASURE E – Placer Hills Fire Protection District**

Shall Placer Hills Fire Protection District be allowed to impose a Special Tax to maintain the current level of fire and life safety services and replace essential equipment, vehicles and facilities?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that consolidated with the Presidential Primary Election the following measure shall be put to a vote of the qualified voters in the North Lake Tahoe Transient Occupancy Tax Area:

## **MEASURE F – North Lake Tahoe Transient Occupancy Tax**

NORTH LAKE TAHOE T-O-T CONTINUATION MEASURE WITH NO TAX INCREASE. To reduce traffic congestion/tourist impacts, support transportation services, build/maintain local bike trails, parks, indoor recreation opportunities, sidewalks, and beaches, and other public services, shall Placer County continue for 10 additional years, with no increase, the existing 2% North Lake Tahoe portion of the Transient Occupancy Tax – paid only by lodging guests, not by local taxpayers – with annual independent audits, continued local oversight, and all funds exclusively for North Lake Tahoe?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that direct arguments for or against said measure(s) shall be submitted to the Placer County Office of Elections. Said arguments shall not exceed 300 words in length and may be received or withdrawn prior to and including March 9, 2012 at 5:00 PM. The Placer County Registrar of Voters shall cause (if submitted) one argument for and/or one argument against said measure(s) to be printed and shall cause to be enclosed a copy thereof in each sample ballot. If multiple arguments are submitted either for or against a measure, the Placer County Registrar of Voters shall choose and print one argument in accordance with applicable law or procedure. Arguments for Measure A will be filed with the Auburn City Clerk. Contact the Auburn City Clerk's office for more information.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that, for individuals interested in submitting arguments for or against said measure(s), the physical address for the Placer County Office of Elections is 2956 Richardson Drive, Auburn. The mailing address for the Placer County Office of Elections is PO Box 5278, Auburn, CA 95604.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that when the Placer County Registrar of Voters has selected the direct arguments for and against said measure(s), the Placer County Registrar of Voters shall send copies of the argument in favor of said measure(s) to the authors of the argument against and copies of the argument against to the authors of the argument in favor. The authors may prepare and submit rebuttal arguments not to exceed 250 words. The rebuttal arguments must be filed with the Placer County Registrar of Voters not later than 10 days after the final date for filing direct arguments. The final date for rebuttal arguments is March 19, 2012 at 5:00 PM.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that California Elections Code Section 9600 governs the form of said arguments and/or rebuttals. Arguments and/or rebuttals submitted to the Placer County Office of Elections must follow this form. Authors of said arguments/rebuttals may call the Office of Elections at 530-886-5650 for more information and a copy of this Elections Code Section.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the last day to register to vote for the Presidential Primary Election is May 21, 2012.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that vote-by-mail ballots will begin to mail on May 7, 2012. The last day for the Office of Elections to mail a requested vote-by-mail ballot is May 29, 2012.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that at the Presidential Primary Election the polls will be open from the hour of 7:00 AM to the hour of 8:00 PM on the day thereof.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that after the polls are closed on the date of said election, the ballots will be transported to the central counting location at the Placer County Office of Elections, 2956 Richardson Drive, Auburn, CA 95603.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the opening and processing of the vote-by-mail ballots for said election will take place at the Placer County Office of Elections starting May 25, 2012 and continue through Election Night, June 5, 2012.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the canvass will commence on or before 8:00 AM on June 7, 2011 at the Placer County Office of Elections.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the Office of Elections will be open for business the two weekends prior to the Presidential Primary Election (May 26 and 27 and June 2 and 3) from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, in accordance with provisions of the election laws of the State of California, that on May 21, 2012 at 10:00 AM, the Placer County Office of Elections will randomly select precincts for a manual tally of one percent (1%) of the precincts casting ballots at the June 5, 2012 Presidential Primary Election.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that this random selection of precincts is open to the public.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that on June 18, 2012 at 9:00 AM, the Placer County Office of Elections will begin a manual tally of one percent (1%) of the precincts casting ballots at the June 5, 2012 Presidential Primary Election.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that this manual tally is open to the public and shall continue daily (Saturdays, Sundays and holidays excluded unless otherwise decided by the County Registrar of Voters) until completed.
