The Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act was designed to assist United States citizens who are active members of the Armed Forces, the Merchant Marine, the Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, their out-of-county dependents, and citizens currently residing outside of the United States.

In order to qualify for the UOCAVA Voting Program, you must be absent from Placer County.

Did You Know?

UOCAVA voters are eligible to register and vote in Placer County using their last known residence address, regardless of whether they still maintain that address or not.

Vote By Mail

Dear Voter,

The Presidential Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 7, 2016 and according to our records you are currently registered as a military or overseas voter and are eligible to participate in the UOCAVA Voting Program. The Uniformed and Overseas Civilian Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) was designed to assist voters who are absent from Placer County with their voting needs, regardless of where they are currently stationed or reside.

As a registered UOCAVA voter, your ballot will be issued around April 8th, 2016. Your ballot will be sent according to the ballot delivery preference you selected on your most recent registration form. If no preference was made, your ballot will be automatically mailed to you. If you wish to designate a new ballot delivery preference, please complete the application provided below. Applications can be submitted by mail, e-mail or fax. Please note: You may need to dial an international number if you are using a fax machine.
