Work at a Polling Place on Election Day

The Placer County Office of Elections is recruiting Poll Workers for the November 4, 2014 Election. Listed are the positions and compensation. If you, someone you know, or you have a Service Club that would like to participate as a fundraiser, are interested, please contact our office for further information.

★INSPECTOR: \$100.00 for the day (plus training class pay)

The Inspector is the head of the precinct board, responsible for pre and post election duties including but not limited to calling their board and poll place contact, meeting drayage, attending a mandatory training class and receiving their precincts' supplies, official ballots and AccuVote OS and TSX machines. The Inspector MUST be able to lift over 30 lbs and have a reliable and accommodating vehicle to transport all supplies and equipment.

★JUDGE: **\$90.00** for the day (plus training class pay)

The Judge is second in command of the polling place. They assist the Inspector on Election Day. If the Inspector is unable to serve, the Judge **MUST** assume the duties of the Inspector.

★CLERKS: \$85.00 for the day (plus training pay if you attend)

Clerks work under the direction of the Inspector who will assign duties on Election Day.

POLL WORKERS MUST BE ABLE TO WORK ON ELECTION DAY FROM 6:00 AM TO APPROXIMATELY 9:00 PM

★TRAINING CLASSES★

It is mandatory for Inspectors and Judges to attend a procedure training class, approximately 3 hours. Inspectors and Judges are paid an additional \$20.00 for procedure class. Clerk training is not mandatory. If Clerks attend a training class they will be paid an additional \$20.00.

★FUNDRAISING FOR GROUPS★

Earnings for groups could be up to \$730.00, depending on the type of polling place and class attendance. This is applicable for service clubs, school booster clubs, church groups, etc. The club mans the entire board and one check is issued to the club. *Clerks with a service club may work half day shifts. Please call for details.
